### Jacobs Apprentice of the Year 2019

The aim of this Award is to celebrate individual excellence in transportation planning and / or civil engineering within our industry.

#### Judging

The judges are looking for the person that has best demonstrated a positive impact in the field of highways or transportation in Scotland and who is making an exceptional contribution to their workplace.

CIHT Scotland Committee members and other judges from the Scottish transport industry will determine which nomination to support for the Scottish Apprentice of the Year Award 2019.

#### Award Details

The Award, sponsored by Jacobs, comprises a £100 Amazon voucher and place at the [National CIHT Young Professionals Conference](#) for the winner. As well as, a £50 Amazon voucher for the runner up.

The winner and runner up will be invited, as a guest, to attend the CIHT Scotland Annual Dinner on **Thursday 10 October at the Raddison Blu Hotel, Glasgow**. The prizes will be presented at the Dinner.

Note, as this Award is being run in tandem with the National Award there are opportunities to be shortlisted for both the National and Scottish Awards.

The deadline for entry is **12 noon on Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2019**

In addition to the terms of the [National Award](#) the additional applicable Scottish Award information is as follows:

1. The Scottish winner and runner-up will be required to provide a single paragraph summary outline of their submission which may be included in a booklet or PowerPoint presentation to be provided at the CIHT Scotland Annual Dinner.
2. The Scottish winner and runner-up should (ideally) be available to attend the CIHT Scotland Annual Dinner.
3. The Scottish winner and runner-up do not automatically qualify for shortlist to the National Award.
