

CIHT Scotland Annual Awards SYSTRA Young Professional of the Year 2019

The aim of the Award is to celebrate individual excellence in Transport Planning and /or Civil Engineering within the highways and transportation sector.

Criteria

Entrants must provide evidence that they are "a young professional with less than 10 years' experience in the industry, who is considered to have made a significant and active impact in Scotland through their contribution to an interesting or notable project."

Eligibility

- A member of CIHT
- Less than 10 years' experience in the industry

Judging

Entries will be assessed by a panel of judges comprising CIHT Scotland Committee members and the Scottish transport industry. Entries failing to meet the specified criteria or which are not submitted in the requested format will not be considered.

Prizes

The Award, sponsored by SYSTRA, comprises a £100 Amazon voucher and place at the <u>National CIHT Young Professionals Conference</u> for the winner. As well as, a £50 Amazon voucher for the runner up.

The winner and runner up will be invited, as a guest, to attend the CIHT Scotland Annual Dinner to be held on **Thursday 10 October at the Raddison Blu Hotel, Glasgow**. The prizes will be presented at the Dinner.



Entry details

The entry should take the form of a maximum 750 word submission stating details of an interesting project they have worked on and their particular involvement in it.

The submission should be made electronically by 12 noon on **Friday 6 September** via scotland@ciht.org.uk

To submit an entry for the award, please e-mail the below entry form and maximum 750 word submission.

- 1. Entry is free.
- 2. Submissions must include a completed entry form.
- 3. Submissions must clearly explain how the entry meets the criteria specified. Entries are limited to 750 words only.
- 4. Entries must include a single paragraph summary outline which may be included in a booklet or PowerPoint presentation to be shown at the Dinner.
- 5. All entries are to be submitted electronically.
- 6. Entries may be accompanied by supporting material (e.g. illustrations, plans or results of monitoring studies) in electronic format, but these will be viewed at the judge's discretion.
- 7. The winner and runner-up should (ideally) be available to attend the CIHT Scotland Annual Dinner.
