CYCLE ROUTE	A route that cyclists are advised to use to reach certain destinations. The term covers on-carriageway cycle lanes, off-carriageway cycle tracks, and any other place where cyclists have the legal right to ride.			
CYCLE LANE	A part of a carriageway allocated for use by cyclists. Includes both areas delineated by road markings, or by a reserve of other physical barrier.	<u>Advisory Lanes</u> : marked with a broken white line which indicates that other vehicles should not enter unless it is safe to do so.




Figure 1: Advisory and Mandatory Cycle Lanes

		<u>Mandatory Lanes</u> : marked with a continuous white line. It is an offence for other vehicles to enter, unless they are exempted.	Figure 1	Photo 2
CYCLE TRACK	A track over which the public have a right of way on pedal cycles that does not form part of a Carriageway but which can be within a highway that includes Carriageway, or a separate highway in its own right.	<u>Single and Bi Directional stepped (hybrid) tracks</u> : Off carriageway lanes set midway between footway level and road level. 		<u>Single and Bi Directional at carriageway level</u> : On carriageway lanes separated from traffic lanes by a kerbed edge or planted strip.	Figure 3	Photo 4
		<u>Segregated dedicated use</u> Cyclists have separately defined alignments at footway/verge level, with segregation by kerb, verge or some other feature	Figure 4	Photo 5
		<u>Segregated shared use</u> : Cyclists and pedestrians have separately defined alignments at footway level, with segregation by raised white line, kerb, verge or some other feature	Figure 5	Photo 6
		<u>Unsegregated shared use</u> : Cyclists and pedestrians have shared alignment at footway/verge level, with no segregation	Figure 5	
REMOTE CYCLE TRACK	A Cycle Track that is a separate highway in its own right.		Figure 6	
CYCLEWAY	A part of the highway allocated for use by cyclists, including both cycle lanes and cycle tracks.

SHARED FOOTWAY AND CYCLETRACK	A way within the boundaries of a highway which also includes a carriageway, over which the public has a right of way on foot and by pedal cycle.		Figure 5	Photo 7
SHARED FOOTPATH AND REMOTE CYCLE TRACK	A way within the boundaries of a highway which does not include a carriageway, over which the public has a right of way on foot and by pedal cycle. 


Figure 2: Stepped Cycle Track




Figure 3: Cycle Track at Carriageway Level with Physical Separation




Figure 4 Segregated Dedicated Use Cycletrack




Figure 5. Segregated and Unsegregated Shared Use Footway and Cycletrack




Figure 6 Remote Cycle Track




Figure 7: Footpath




Figure 8: Segregated Shared Footpath and Remote Cycle Track




Figure 9: Unsegregated Shared Footpath and Remote Cycle Track
