Project Awards 2022

The criteria for this year's Awards are aligned with the seven goals of the Well-being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015. We want to better understand how your projects will contribute to the achievement of these goals. We would like you to demonstrate that the transportation business is leading rather than trailing and that it is making a positive contribution to the government's aims, objectives and targets. Also, to hear, see and recognise to what extent you have applied the five ways of working. The five ways of working are explained in detail in the Wellbeing of Future Generations Act guidance and are:

- Long Term
- Prevention
- Integration
- Collaboration
- Involvement

Your submission to the Cymru Wales CIHT Awards should explain how you have achieved these five ways of working in the context of the seven goals of the Act.

The Well-being of Future Generations Act requires public bodies in Wales to think about the long-term impact of their decisions, to work better with people, communities and each other, and to prevent persistent problems such as poverty, health inequalities and climate change.

The development of Highways and Transportation schemes in Wales is governed by Welsh Transport Appraisal Guidance (WelTAG).

WelTAG is a framework for thinking about proposed changes to the transport system. It contains best practice for the development,

appraisal and evaluation of proposed transport interventions in Wales. It has been developed by the Welsh Government to ensure that public funds are invested in a way that ensures they maximise contribution to the well-being of Wales, as set out in the Well-being of Future Generations (Wales) Act 2015 and to deliver the Act's vision of the Wales we want:

- a more <u>prosperous</u> Wales,
- a resilient Wales,
- a healthier Wales,
- a more equal Wales,
- a Wales of more <u>cohesive communities</u>,
- a Wales of vibrant culture
- a <u>globally responsible</u> Wales.

The judges will, when assessing this year's entries, consider how your project has and will contribute to the achievement of the seven goals using the five ways of working during its preparation, planning, design, construction, operation and maintenance. You should, when submitting your entry, include a short paragraph explaining how and to what extent your project is aligned with each of the seven goals and five ways of working.
