I started my career as a Trainee Technician for a consultancy in 2017, in Transport and Infrastructure Design, moving to a secondment in a public sector Highways Department, starting as an Engineering Technician with Waterman Aspen in 2018. At Waterman Aspen I have been granted experience in a variety of roles on numerous schemes of varying size and scope, including HS2. Over the past five and a half years I have worked my way up to Area Manager and am seconded as a Transportation Planning Project manager. I am also a mentor for current apprentices.

How will your particular skills and experience benefit Council? Give some examples from your professional or personal life that show you have the right skill set to contribute to the work of Council.

My four and a half years in the industry have afforded me a wealth of experience and exposure across the public and private sector. I hold a BEng (Hons) in Civil and Transportation Engineering with a 1st classification and I am an Incorporated Engineer, which I gained as part of a degree apprenticeship.

I am currently studying an MSt in Interdisciplinary Design for the Built Environment from the University of Cambridge, which takes the processes of multidisciplinary design further, with allied professions working closely together at all stages of a design to incorporate sustainability and resilience throughout all stages of a project, from inception to implementation and use.

I am currently a member of the West Midlands Young Professionals Committee, registered as a STEM ambassador, as well as a mentor for apprentices who are preparing for their End Point Assessment and EngTech applicants.
