Travelling to Nottingham Trent University City Campus



By car

Nottingham is at the heart of the country and is well served by the motorway network.

The M1 passes close to the west of the city, the A42 / M42 link to the south-west of the city and the A1(M) to the east of the city. When using the M1 from the North, exit at Junction 26, and take the A610 Nuthall Road / Alfreton Road into the city. When using the M1 from the South, use Junction 24 and follow the A453 into the city centre.

University car parks on the City Campus are not open to visitors. There are a number of public car parks nearby. The Forest park and ride tram service is particularly convenient and always popular with visitors. Parking for people with disabilities will be accommodated on the campus if possible.

The Nottingham Express Transit (NET) tram stops on the University's City Campus, providing a convenient link from the railway station and Broadmarsh Bus Station. There are also several park and ride stops along the route, which provide convenient places to park when visiting the University. The Phoenix Park park and ride site is close to Junction 26 of the M1, and the Forest park and ride site is near to the city centre.
