
## **Bradford Clean Air Zone**



We have a Clean Air Zone (CAZ) to improve air quality and reduce pollution to within legal limits, benefitting the health of everyone who lives and works in Bradford

The CAZ will also reduce Carbon Dioxide equivalent (CO2e) transport emissions by over 150,000 tonnes.




#### Why does Bradford have a Clean Air Zone?

- NO<sub>2</sub> Exceedances A650, Mayo Avenue,
  Tong Street, Manningham Lane, Queens Road and Bingley Road, Saltaire
- The CAZ will ensure legal limits for NO<sub>2</sub> are met
- Biggest improvements in areas with highest deprivation

## CAZ - How does it work?

- Ministerial Direction Provision in Transport Act 2000
- 330 automatic number plate recognition
- cameras along the boundary and inside the zone
- Data sent to Central Service (DVLA)
- Non-compliant, older ~2015/16 commercial vehicles
- Identified (~4% of traffic)
- National & Local white list
- Charges collected centrally by DVLA
- Unpaid journeys processed by Local Authority
- The most effective Clean Air Zone does not take any charges
- Charges are legally ringfenced for sustainable transport

£1.63m to support buses (grant circa £16,000)

**£1.66m** to support coaches (grant circa £16,000)

£11.74m to support taxis (grants from £3,200 to £5,000)

**£6.42m** to support HGVs (grants up to £16,000)

£10.18m to support LGVs (grants up to £4,500)

£175,500 to support minibuses (grants up to £4,500)

All residents of Bradford District 1 Exemption

SME Businesses can have 3 exemptions (+ grants)

This includes self-employed

Does not include cars/motorbikes

Exemptions for community transport, charities

85% of the older commercial vehicles causing the problem come from outside Bradford











## Air Quality is improving


Data has been collected at air quality monitoring sites inside the CAZ.

What is value for money of the Bradford Clean Air Plan 3 years post implementation and longer term?





## Clean Air Schools Programme

The Bradford Clean Air Schools Programme (CASP) is a Bradford Council initiative funded by the Bradford Clean Air Zone (CAZ).



The CASP seeks to further improve air quality at schools by providing targeted funding direct to schools to help them implement bespoke emission and exposure reduction measures ensuring schools become cleaner, healthier places for Bradford's children.

This will be done via grants, enforcing anti idling legislation and working on engagement projects.



## **Electric Vehicle Grants**

#### **Bradford Licenced Taxi Trade**

£4.1m for upgrade of licensed taxi vehicles to a fully electric vehicle.

Grants of up to £10,000 per vehicle are available for running costs of a fully electric vehicle licensed with Bradford Council ,there has been over 1,000 applications





#### **Bradford Heavy Goods Vehicles**

Bradford Council are providing a revenue grant to support the operations of a fully electric HGV. We will report on the driving experience, use vehicle telematics information to work out the savings compared to a non-electric HGV.

#### **CAZ Benefits For Bradford**

- Measurable improvements in health (<u>Bradford CAZ published paper</u>)
- Reductions in pollution, with the biggest reductions in the most deprived areas
- Additional investment from Government £46m for the CAZ and additional £8m for zero emission bus upgrades in 2025.
- Fleet transformation to the cleanest taxi fleet in the UK with mainly petrol hybrid plus 800 electric vehicles, supported by the Councils grant scheme.
- CAZ provides a ringfenced revenue stream which provides a platform for public and private inward investment in clean growth such as;
- i) The largest Green Hydrogen production facility in the UK (2026)
- ii) District Heat Network
- iii) E-bike hire scheme, Industrial decarbonisation and many other projects
